Recycled uniform

As an eco-school we strongly encourage the recycling of uniform. Many parents donate good quality second-hand uniform to school once their children have grown out of it.

Jewellery Rule

We wish to maintain the health and safety for our children and to avoid time wasting for pupils by removing jewellery for PE lessons so we ask that earrings are not worn on PE days, or that they are covered. Earrings that are worn within school should be plain studs.

This is to maximise opportunities for our pupils to be involved in daily physical activities. If parents choose to pierce their children's ears, we ask that it is at the start of the school Summer holidays so that they can be removed for school.

Footwear

The school wants all children to grow into healthy adults. We believe that it is dangerous for children to wear shoes that have platform soles or high heels and we strongly discourage the wearing of such.

Make-up and nail varnish should not be worn to school. The children will be given wipes to remove this if necessary.

Hair Cuts

At Ysgol Minafon we ask all parents to support our policy in ensuring appropriate sensible haircuts are part of school life. Mohicans, tramlines, hair dye, logos etc are not encouraged.

The Role of Parents

We ask all parents who send their children to our school to support the school uniform policy. It is the responsibility of parents to ensure that their child has the correct uniform and that it is clean and in good repair.

The Role of Governors

It is the governors' responsibility to ensure that the school uniform meets all the regulations concerning equal opportunities.

The governors will consider, with the Headteacher, any requests from parents for individual children to have special dispensation, either for religious or medical reasons, with regard to school uniform.

This policy, which has been endorsed by the *Governing Body*, will be reviewed regularly.
